


Chapter Meeting Minutes: October 2022


Theta Nu Chapter Meeting Minutes October 6, 2022






New Business:

(You can put each person's set of cards on one or two pages.) Temporarily store these pages in an envelope and put them in a safe, but handy place.

- □ Credit cards [front and back], so that you'll have the phone numbers to call in case of loss or theft
- □ Social Security card
- □ Health insurance cards
- □ Other ID cards from work, school, organizations or associations, including a copy of your DKG membership card.

Don't Be Left Behind: Facebook

If you listen to the old rumors, Facebook leaves you open to exposure on the Internet. But with new protocols and a little knowledge about creating a FB profile, the risk is limited. Cindy Loughmiller wrote these directions for us.

To create a Facebook account:

- 1. Go to facebook.com/reg.
- 2. Enter the name you go by in everyday life.
- 3. Enter your email or mobile phone number.
- 4. Select your gender and date of birth, and choose a password.
- 5. Tap Sign Up.
- 6. To finish creating your account, you need to confirm your email or mobile phone number.
- 7. When you set your profile, you can just leave everything blank that would let people know your school, hometown, etc.
- 8. Also, under your profile, go to Setting and Privacy. Then Privacy Center. You will see many options to click through to limit who can see your information, or search for you.
