
Theta Nu Book Club

Theta Nu Chapter Meeting Minutes September 5, 2023

The regular chapter meeting was called to order at 4:30 with 9 members present thus establishing a quorum. A welcome back greeting was given to all after a nice summer break by President BeverlyK. Inspiration was given by CathiP. Beverly gave the treasurer's report with \$3,182.70 in the checking account and \$2,963.28 in the savings account. A motion to approve the minutes attached to the newsletter was made and accepted.

Old Business:

*Last year's donations from checks for cereal (Whitehouse Food Pantry) was \$1,450.00 in addition to the boxes of cereal donated. The members voted to continue giving to the foodbank as the main chapter project.

*The Secret Sister activity was evaluated and the decision was made to not continue at the present time.

New Business:

*The TSO theme for the new biennium, SOAR: <u>Seek</u> new members and opportunities, <u>open</u> your heart, mind, and attitude, <u>Act</u> to serve and share, <u>Reach</u> to renew, respond, and relate was discussed. *Thoughts about next year were discussed for possibly one year President term or a Co-President for support. Beverly Kelly shared her experience with the group.

*To encourage the recipient of the Beginning Teacher Aware, a monthly treat for Landon Odom were prepared. SharonG provided treat bags with inspiring quotes, and members will provide some kind. These treats will be delivered to Landon's campus.

*For the monthly One and Done project, gently used purses were stuffed with toiletries for women at the East Texas Crisis Center.

Personal:

*Long time member, MeriamE, passed away. Her memorial service is on November 11 at Marvin Methodist at 10:00am.

*Birthday cards were collected for KarlyeneH. Some members were going to deliver them along with flowers.

Theta Nu Executive Board Minutes... May 18, 2023

The spring Executive Board Meeting of Theta Nu Chapter was called to order by BeverlyK, president, at 5:30pm on Thursday, May 18, 2023, at the Corner Bakery.

All board members were present.

New Business:

The board was asked for program and projects ideas for 2023-2024. A list of possible programs and One and Done projects was created. BeverlyK and CindyL, vice-president, will narrow the lists and set the final meeting programs for the year. SharonG, yearbook editor and webmaster, will create the meeting calendar and include it in the yearbook and on the chapter website.

With the hope of attracting new members, Beverly had asked CindyL and Sharon to brainstorm some new ideas for raising the awareness of Theta Nu to all the teachers and staff in Whitehouse ISD. They narrowed their ideas to one suggestion. Knowing that door prizes are given at the annual Convocation, the recommendation was to give a gift of an Amazon Wishlist for \$150 to a beginning certified teacher or media specialist (male or female) and be selected through a random drawing. Money for this project would be funded by the annual donation to the chapter by an unnamed benefactor.

A question was raised about whether men could be included since DKG is a women's organization, and scholarship and grants are restricted to women. Sharon made a reference to ASTEF guidelines to which all Texas members belong to. ASTEF guidelines: "Because ASTEF is a public charity and serves members as well as non-members, projects that serve teachers and other educators must include both men and women in the provision of all goods, services, and activities. Men must not be excluded...[We] are encouraged to consider projects related to the DKG international focus of Supporting Early-Career Educators and to incorporate some form of mentoring activities and encouragement for early-career teachers in addition to the more tangible forms of support, such as teacher and classroom supplies that are so desperately needed by new teachers." (2023-2024 Project Stipend Application Guidelines).

A motion was made by NancyB, secretary, to recommend giving the Beginning Teacher Award for one year and ask the members to vote via electronic means since there would be no chapter meeting before the Convocation. The motion carried.

TeriG, treasurer, made a motion to add a third signature to the checking and savings account card at Austin Bank as a backup in case either the treasurer or president were not available to sign a check.

After a discussion the Executive Board voted to add a third signature. The third signature is not required and will only be used if necessary. The member who will be the third signature will be selected by the president and must live in Whitehouse or Tyler. The motion carried.



Cost of Living Raise for Texas Retired Teachers

During the last Texas Legislative session, a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for TRS retirees was approved. BUT, for this to really happen, Texas must approve an amendment to the Texas Constitution to allow for a COLA for educators. Proposition 9 will NOT increase Texas taxes because funds for the amendment
